Divine Mercy Sunday is a Roman Catholic solemnity celebrated on the First Sunday after Easter, the Octave of Easter. It is originally based on the Catholic devotion to the Divine Mercy that **Saint Faustina Kowalska** reported as part of her encounter with Jesus, and is associated with special promises from Jesus and indulgences issued by the Church.

This feast of Divine Mercy, as recorded in the diary of Saint Faustina, receives from Jesus himself the biggest promises of Grace related to the Devotion of Divine Mercy. In specific Jesus states *'that the soul that goes to Sacramental Confession (the confession may take place some days before), and receive Holy Eucharistic Communion on that day, shall obtain the total forgiveness of all sins and punishment.'*

The devotion to Divine Mercy Sunday grew rapidly after its designation by **Pope John Paul II** and is now widely celebrated by Catholics.^[16] The Divine Mercy image is often carried in processions on Divine Mercy Sunday, and is placed in a location in the church so that it can be venerated by those who attended the Mass.

Questa causa è Mia ed è scaturita dal seno della Santissima Trinità, che attraverso il Verbo vi fa conoscere l'abisso della Divina Misericordia. Desidero che questa Festa venga celebrata solennemente la prima Domenica dopo la Pasqua. »

St. Joseph will help them put into perspective the nobility of work which will instill a strong motivation to fall back on in difficult times.

EXCERPTS FROM THE "URBI ET ORBI" MESSAGE OF POPE FRANCIS – Easter 2025

...From the empty tomb in Jerusalem, we hear unexpected good news: Jesus, who was crucified, "is not here, he has risen" (Lk 24:5). Jesus is not in the tomb, he is alive!

...The resurrection of Jesus is indeed the basis of our hope. For in the light of this event, hope is no longer an illusion. Thanks to Christ – crucified and risen from the dead – hope does not disappoint! *Spes non confundit!* (cf. Rom 5:5).

...I would like us to renew our hope that peace is possible! From the Holy Sepulchre, the Church of the Resurrection, where this year Easter is celebrated by Catholics and Orthodox on the same day, may the light of peace radiate throughout the Holy Land and the entire world. I express my closeness to the sufferings of Christians in Palestine and Israel, and to all the Israeli people and the Palestinian people. ...Let us pray for the Christian communities in Lebanon and in Syria, presently experiencing a delicate transition in its history. ...I also think in particular of the people in Yemen, who are experiencing one of the world's most serious and prolonged humanitarian crisis because of war, and I invite all to find solutions through a constructive dialogue.

...May the risen Christ grant Ukraine, devastated by war, his Easter gift of peace, and encourage all parties involved to pursue efforts aimed at achieving a just and lasting peace.

...In the Lord's Paschal Mystery, death and life contended in a stupendous struggle, but the Lord now lives forever (cf. *Easter Sequence*). He fills us with the certainty that we too are called to share in the life that knows no end, when the clash of arms and the rumble of death will be heard no more. Let us entrust ourselves to him, for he alone can make all things new (cf. Rev. 21:5).
